

An Interactive Homework System

Homework is a wonderful way to connect with families. Because it is a system that most families are familiar with, you can really take advantage of the daily connection it provides.

One way to strengthen your homework system is to add a weekly cover sheet to the homework you are already preparing. Adding a cover sheet allows you to build in communication from school, and ask for communication back from home. It allows you to include non-worksheet based activities such as reading logs or continued APTT practice. And finally, it asks for daily family involvement with homework by asking for family members to initial each day.

Families love having a standard system for homework. It creates consistency even if the assignments are changing from night to night.

Some things to consider:

- 1. You can fill out the weekly cover sheet on the computer or by hand and photocopy it along with the homework. This only takes an additional 10-15 minutes each week.
- 2. You can photocopy a blank page and have students fill out their homework each night. This may lead to investment and accountability for students, and will save you time.

Tips for Teachers

- Consider how you can strengthen your homework system with a weekly cover sheet. What is the easiest way to build on the homework you are already sending home so it becomes a method of ongoing communication in addition to academic practice?
- Keep families updated on what you are doing! Families love hearing about what happens with their children during the day.
- Be flexible! If families are unable to check homework each night, consider creating an alternative schedule that works with their needs.
- Keep track weekly of homework completion. This will keep students and families accountable. Make phone calls home when work is not complete and see if alternative arrangements need to be created. You can even have students take out the completed week of homework and have their binders open for easy insertion.

School Leaders: how can you help?

- Support teachers by having clear homework expectations for teachers and students
- Communicate the importance of supporting learning at home in whole school communications
- Celebrate students and families that consistently complete homework.
